Conditions Comments: Threeleaf Sumac is drought tolerant and useful in erosion control because of its suckering habit. Colonies are often single-sexed, formed from a single, suckering parent. Only female plants produce flowers and berries.

Conditions Comments: Seeds are used as a peppery spice, thus the common name. This is a short-lived perennial so some seedlings must be allowed to survive for replacement plants.

In a meadow, it can be cut back in early summer after the first wave of blooms. It will bloom year-round in warm weather.
